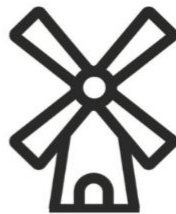

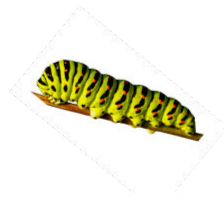
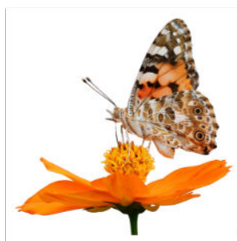

Tysoe's Spiced Apple Cake

Cake Ingredients

200g butter, softened
200g soft brown sugar
200g self-raising flour
1 tsp ground allspice
½ tsp ground cinnamon
4 large eggs, beaten
4 small apples* cored & diced
1 large apple* cored & sliced

Cinnamon topping

50g caster sugar
1 tsp ground cinnamon
1tbsp butter, melted

Sugar glaze

30g icing sugar sifted
1-2tbsp milk

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 180°C fan, 200°C electric or gas mark 6.
Grease a 18cm round cake tin and line with baking paper.

For the cake: Place all of the ingredients, except the apples into a large bowl or food mixer and beat together for 2-3 minutes until well mixed. Add the 4 diced apples and stir into the mixture. Spoon the cake mixture into the tin and arrange the slices of apple over the top.

For the cinnamon topping: Combine sugar, cinnamon and butter. Mix together until lumpy and wet. Sprinkle over cake batter.

Bake for 55-60 minutes, until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Cool in the pan for 10 minutes, then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.

For the glaze: Mix together icing sugar and 1 tbsp of milk. Stir until smooth. If the glaze is too thick, add extra milk. Drizzle glaze all over the cake.

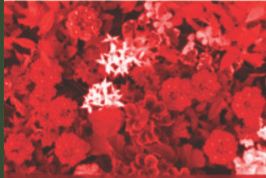
